- The Division of Social Sciences and Life Skills has received a Teaching American History Grant from the U.S. Department of Education to provide a cohort of 30 5th grade teachers with professional development concentrating on content and innovative instructional strategies.
 - The following details regarding this professional development opportunity must be noted:
 - Participation is voluntary.
 - Priority access to this program will be given to teachers who work in schools that have NOT met Adequate Yearly Progress.
 - Teachers participating in the cohort **must** attend all 7 days of workshops.
 - Teachers participating in the cohort **must** attend a 5 day summer institute.
 - Participating teachers **must** currently teach American history, the required social studies to at least one group of 5th grade students.
 - Participating teachers **must** be willing to take a pre and post test regarding their knowledge of American history and administer a pre and post test to their students as well. Results of said measurements will be used for purposes of evaluating the effectiveness of the professional development experience **only**.
 - Participating teachers will earn a total of 50 Master Plan Points for the trainings taking place throughout the school year AND 30 Master Plan Points for the one-week summer institute; receive valuable content knowledge and instructional strategies and resources provided by Florida International University faculty from the department of History and the College of Education and attend training on how to use Learners Online Web lessons to supplement their teaching of American History.
 - Participating teachers will be provided with substitute coverage for any workshops that take place during the work week and a \$100.00 stipend for workshops that take place on Saturdays. Teachers will also be paid \$100.00 stipend for each day of the one-week summer institute.
 - The dates of the professional development sessions are as follows:
