- The purpose of the workshop is to provide AAH Advocates with updated AAH lessons and best practices for infusing African American history into M-DCPS' K-12 curriculum.
- The Latin American and Caribbean Center (LACC), founded in 1979, is dedicated to the promotion of the study of Latin America and the Caribbean in Florida and throughout the United States.
