- **2012 Black History essay prompt:**
 African American women have made a difference in history for many years. Think of the reasons accomplishments that have made them famous.
 Now, think of any African American woman who is not famous but who has made a big difference in your life and or community.
 Now, write to explain to your reader what makes this African American woman important enough to be included in an African American women hero's history book.

BLACK HISTORY ESSAY CONTEST GUIDELINES

- Elementary school students up to grade 5 are eligible to participate in this contest. Sixth grade students who are still housed in an elementary school and sixth grade students in a K-8 center must enter the middle school competition.
- Essays must be typed, with a maximum length of 500 words (2 pages), double spaced on white paper, and stapled on the upper left hand corner. The prompt must be typed on the cover sheet. The cover sheet must also include the student's name, email address, phone number (cell/home), grade level, and school. Failure to follow these guidelines will result in disqualification.
- All entries will be evaluated in their entirety with consideration being given to the following four elements: focus, organization, support and conventions.
