BLACK HISTORY ESSAY CONTEST GUIDELINES

- The secondary categories are grades 6-8 and 9-12.
- o BLACK HISTORY PROMPT:

African Americans have faced and continue to face unique issues during times of war beginning with the French and Indian War and the American Revolution to the present "War on Terrorism." Research the unique experience of African Americans during times of war and explain to your reader the important role African Americans have had accordingly.

- Essays must be typed, with a maximum length of 500 words (2 pages), double spaced on white paper, and stapled on the upper left-hand corner. The prompt must be typed on the cover sheet. The cover sheet must also include the following:
 - Student's name;
 - Grade level:
 - Email address;
 - Phone number (cell/home);
 - Teacher's name and email address; and
 - School name.
- Failure to follow these guidelines will result in disqualification.
- All entries will be evaluated in their entirety with consideration being given to the following four elements: focus, organization, support and conventions.
