The Division of Social Sciences and Life Skills, in cooperation with the Muriel F. Siebert Foundation, is sponsoring a one-day financial literacy workshop for 7th grade Civics and 12th grade Economics teachers.

- To become financially literate, students need to understand the functions of financial institutions, the problems related to debt and credit, and the investment options open to them as adults.
 - To assist Civics and Economics teachers in their efforts to teach financial literacy through their required curriculum, a one-day workshop is being sponsored by the Division of Social Sciences and Life Skills, in cooperation with the Muriel F. Siebert Foundation.
 - The workshop will be held on Saturday, April 17, 2010 from 9:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. at the Historical Museum of Southern Florida, 101 West Flagler Street, Miami, Florida, 33130, Phone: 305-375-1492.
 - Teachers participating in the workshop will receive free teaching materials, a \$100 stipend, and 8 MPP pending completion of a homework assignment following the workshop.
 - This is the second teacher workshop sponsored by the Muriel F. Siebert Foundation this school year. Teachers who attended the first workshop **should not register** for this second session since the content is essentially the same.
 - Parking is available at a flat rate of \$5.00 in the municipal garage immediately west of the Museum. The Museum is also accessible from the Metrorail.
 - Registration will take place on-line through the M-DCPS Professional Development Menu and Registration System. Click on "Find a Session by Instructor." The Financial Literacy workshop instructor is listed as Alayne Zeto.
 - Registration is limited to 30 middle and 30 senior high school teachers with preference given to 7th grade Civics and 12th grade Economics teachers.
