To recognize that May 18th is celebrated each year as Haitian Flag Day.

- The Haitian flag was created on May 18th, 1803 in the midst of the country's war for independence from France. Haiti had been a colony of France since 1697, but the people rebelled in 1803 and Haiti achieved independence on January 1, 1804.
- In Haiti, Flag Day is a major national holiday celebrated with great fanfare on the grounds of the national palace and all cities in the country.
