- Project Citizen is a program, co-sponsored by the Center for Civic Education and the Florida Law Related Education Association, designed to provide educational opportunities for middle school students to identify community problems and propose public policy solutions to these problems.

 - This year's Project Citizen Student Showcase is tentatively scheduled for April 8, 2010 at a location to be announced later.
