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- The 21st Annual National African American Read-in Chain is scheduled for Monday, February 8, 2010. On this day, schools are urged to make literacy a significant part of Black History Month by hosting and coordinating Read-Ins.
 - The 21st Annual National African American Read-in Chain is endorsed by the NCTE Black Caucus, the National Council of Teachers of English (NCTE), and the International Reading Association.
 - To be counted as participants, simply select and read books authored by African Americans.
 - The HOST REPORT CARDS are used to compute the number of participants each year and produce an annual report card for the event. With the submission of host report cards, names are added to the data base, giving tangible evidence of your role in making literacy a significant part of Black History Month. **To be an official participant, YOU MUST SUBMIT A HOST REPORT CARD.**
