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- The U.S. Fund for UNICEF is a nonprofit organization that supports UNICEF's work and other efforts to put children first through education, advocacy and fundraising here in the United States. We work with civil society organizations, governments, celebrities, faith-based organizations, schools, educators, students and volunteers to advocate for the survival and well-being of every child.
- The organization seeks to promote global citizenship through engagement opportunities and its organizational resources, including:
- [TeachUNICEF](#) provides educators and youth service professionals with global learning resources for grades Pre-K through 12, such as in-person workshops, school-based programming, free web-based lessons plans, videos, multi-media resources and more. These lessons are interdisciplinary and aligned to state and national educational standards. Topics range from child labor and poverty to gender equality.
- [UNICEF High School Clubs](#) are driven by students who desire to play a vital role in helping the world's children. Clubs partner with the U.S. Fund for UNICEF to educate, advocate and fundraise on behalf of the world's children by producing benefit concerts, participating in U.S. Fund initiatives and attending national conferences to share ideas.
