Announcing the Division of Academics, Department of Social Sciences is sponsoring the 30th annual "We the People... The Citizen and the Constitution" District competition.

- The "We the People...The Citizen and the Constitution" competition provides Senior High and Middle School students with the opportunity to demonstrate their knowledge of the U.S. Constitution and Bill of Rights by taking part in a simulated congressional hearing.
- This year's competition is scheduled for Thursday, January 11, 2018 for Middle Schools and Friday, January 12, 2018 for Senior High Schools at the James L. Knight Center: 400 SE 2nd Ave, Miami, FL 33131.
- To assist in covering costs associated with the District competition, each public and charter school participating must pay a \$100.00 registration fee and each private school must pay a \$200.00 registration fee. Details of how to submit payment will be sent directly to the team sponsors once the registration deadline has expired.
- **Only one winning Senior High School team, as well as, one winning Middle School team will travel to Orlando on February 2, 2018**, to compete in the state competition.
- The Department of Social Sciences will assist schools in covering costs incurred in advancing to the state level competition.
- Teachers must have implemented all six units of the "We the People...The Citizen and the Constitution" curriculum to participate in the competition.
